

Nolan Lamkin with Tom Wood Powersports continues success in Minnesota



BRAINERD, MN. - Nolan Lamkin continued his success in Minnesota at the Brainerd International Raceway. Lamkin races in 2x classes, Stock 1000 and the Superbike Cup. Lamkin and the team made improvements, cutting almost 2 seconds off of their previous best lap time in 2022.

He continues to lead the Superbike Cup with a 73-point advantage over 2nd place, with another 1st place and win, along with a 2nd place finish.

In Stock 1000, after a 6th place finish on Saturday,

he improved tremendously on Sunday. Battling his way up from 10th place to finish in 4th, he battled with Travis Wyman and Ezra Beabier—one, a multi-time race winner, and the other, the championship points leader respectively.

Nolan Lamkin: "We had a great time in Minnesota! We were involved in some great battles this whole weekend. We started out on Friday getting an electronic update to our BMW S1000rr. That required us to find new settings with the bike but was great.

In the Superbike Cup, we finished 2nd on Saturday and we were able to improve the bike for Sunday, we won the race, plus beat 2nd place by over 10 seconds.

Sunday in Stock 1000, we were in 10th place on the first lap but made continuous progress through the field. We were very strong in the first sector which opened up new passing opportunities. I made my way through the pack and was in 6th behind Wyman, I then was able to ride around the outside of him through the 125 mph Turn 1, which was crazy. I saw



that Ezra Beaubier, who was now ahead of me, (the current points leader and who finished 5th) had jumped the start and that he was given a 5-second jump start penalty. I tried a few different passes but on the last lap, I was able to pass him on the exit of Turn 2. I wanted to try and run down 2nd and 3rd place, in case anything happened to either of them, I could be there to capitalize. Unfortunately, it didnt work out with Ezra losing control and diving up the inside of us in Turn 3 which cost us both 2 seconds.

I need to give a huge thank you to my guys for all of their hard work this weekend! They were incredible with all they do- Dustin, Donny, Weir Everywhere Racing, and Jeffery."

Round 7 of the MotoAmerica championship is **August 18th-20th** at Pittsburgh International Race Complex, near Pittsburgh, PA.
